Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct represents MER MEC's general expectations of its suppliers. MER MEC adopts the principles of the Global Compact and asks its suppliers to commit to each of the following points, in the following three categories: Human Rights & Labour; Environment; Integrity and Anti-corruption.

The initiation and continuation of MER MEC's business relations with suppliers are based on the degree of involvement and application of these points by the suppliers.

HUMAN RIGHTS & LABOUR

Prohibition of child labour

The supplier recognises and respects human and children's rights, such as the right to play and the right to education. It undertakes to respect the minimum age for employment and to take measures to identify and prevent any form of child exploitation.

Prohibition of forced labour

The supplier recognises fundamental labour rights, including the protection of workers' health and safety and respect for the freedom of association of its employees. It condemns any form of forced or compulsory labour and slavery and ensures that its employees are not restricted by physical restraints, abuse and threats.

Occupational health and safety

The supplier complies with occupational safety and health laws and undertakes to provide and maintain a healthy and safe working environment for employees by identifying and managing risks, implementing appropriate preventive measures and assessing their effectiveness.

Fair wages, working hours

The supplier pays employees a fair wage for the work carried out and complies with the laws on minimum wage, working hours and weekly rest periods.

It also recognises the right to rest and leisure, guaranteeing the reconciliation of work and private life.

Prohibition of discrimination, appreciation of diversity

The supplier undertakes to:

- guarantee impartiality, eliminating prejudices and repudiating any form of direct or indirect, multiple and interlinked discrimination in relation to gender, age, orientation and identity, disability, health status, ethnic origin, nationality, political opinions, social category and religious faith;

promote inclusive and transparent working conditions that enable the removal of cultural, organisational and relational obstacles, fostering an optimal work-life balance and equal opportunities between people;

ENVIRONMENT

Reduction of pollution and waste of resources

The supplier is committed to protecting the environment, minimising environmental impacts and optimising the use of energy, natural and water resources. It respects and promotes compliance with international obligations on climate change such as the reduction of CO2 emissions.

It manages and monitors the environmental aspects related to its business activities, following internationally recognised environmental management models.

Moreover, with a view to sustainable development, it carries out its business operations in a responsible manner without compromising the needs of future generations.

Waste management and material recycling

The supplier takes the necessary measures to reduce the amount of waste produced and promote circular economy, such as the reuse and recycling of products. Where this is not possible, the supplier ensures the correct disposal of the product.

Biodiversity

The supplier undertakes to respect, preserve, protect and promote biodiversity in all its operations and throughout the supply chain. It also works to defend areas of high conservation value.

INTEGRITY AND ANTI-CORRUPTION

Management systems

The supplier also undertakes to pursue sustainable development by obtaining voluntary certifications. It also takes steps to implement management systems (including objectives, policies, manuals, procedures, instructions and forms).

Integrity, protection of privacy

The supplier must operate in compliance with applicable international, EU, national, regional and local laws and regulations.

It must also process any personal data and confidential information acquired in compliance with data protection and information privacy laws. The supplier must protect the right to privacy of the parties with whom it interfaces, using the data and information collected only for legitimate, defined and appropriate purposes.

Anti-corruption and illegal activities

The supplier must refrain from engaging in any form of corruption. Abuse or misuse of mandated powers for personal gain is not tolerated.

The supplier must respect the principles of free competition, loyalty and fairness, without favouring or tolerating any violations of Human Rights and other illegal activities.

Italian Legislative Decree 231/2001 (Administrative responsibility of entities) and Code of Ethics

The supplier undertakes to comply with the control systems defined by MER MEC within its Organisation, Management and Control Model pursuant to Italian Legislative Decree 231/2001, as well as the ethical and behavioural principles set out in its own code of ethics.

Declaration of Commitment

When filling in the supplier assessment and qualification questionnaire, MER MEC asks the supplier to sign this document with which the supplier undertakes to accept the Group's policies, to comply with MER MEC's Code of Conduct and share and transmit its values throughout its supply chain.

The supplier, in turn, also undertakes to make sustainable purchases, considering, in its purchasing decisions, the environmental, social and ethical performance of the products or services supplied, throughout their entire life cycle.
